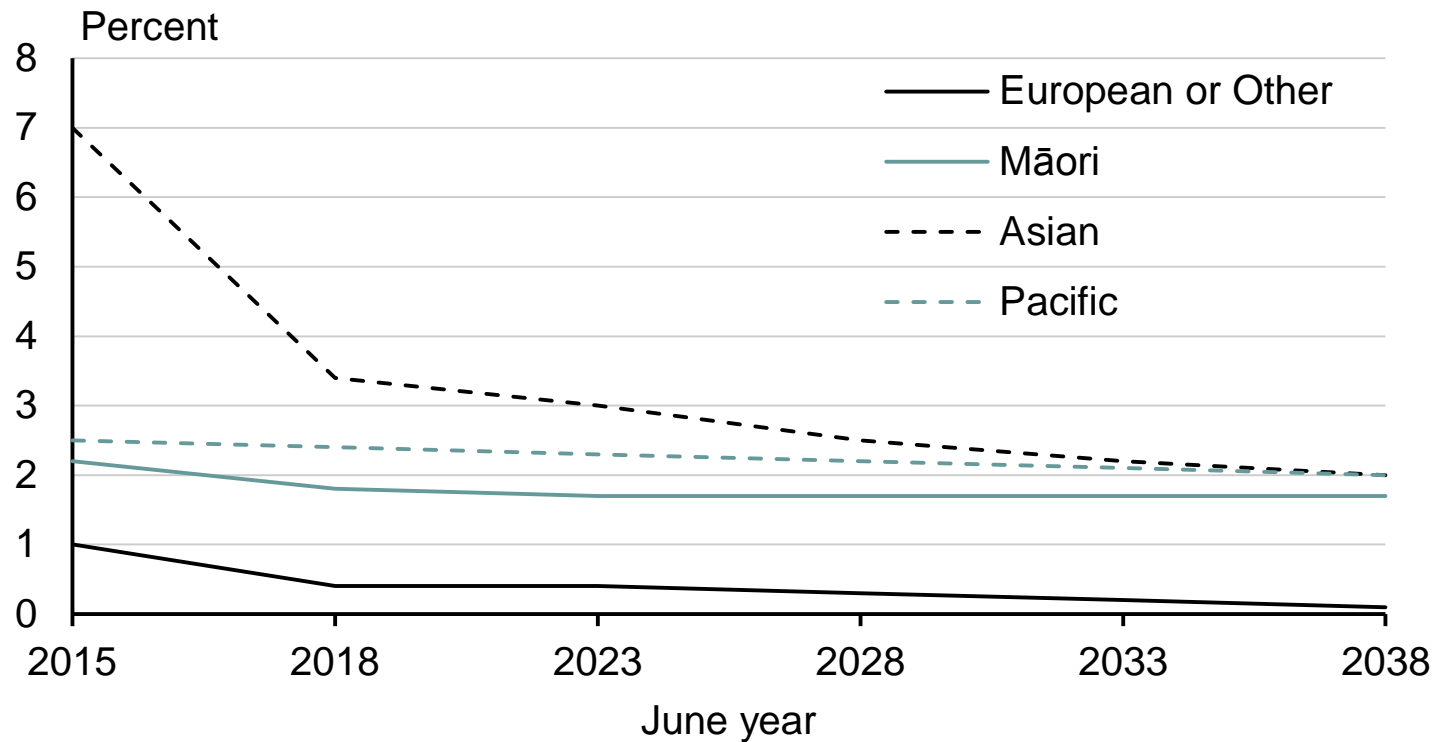

2015–38

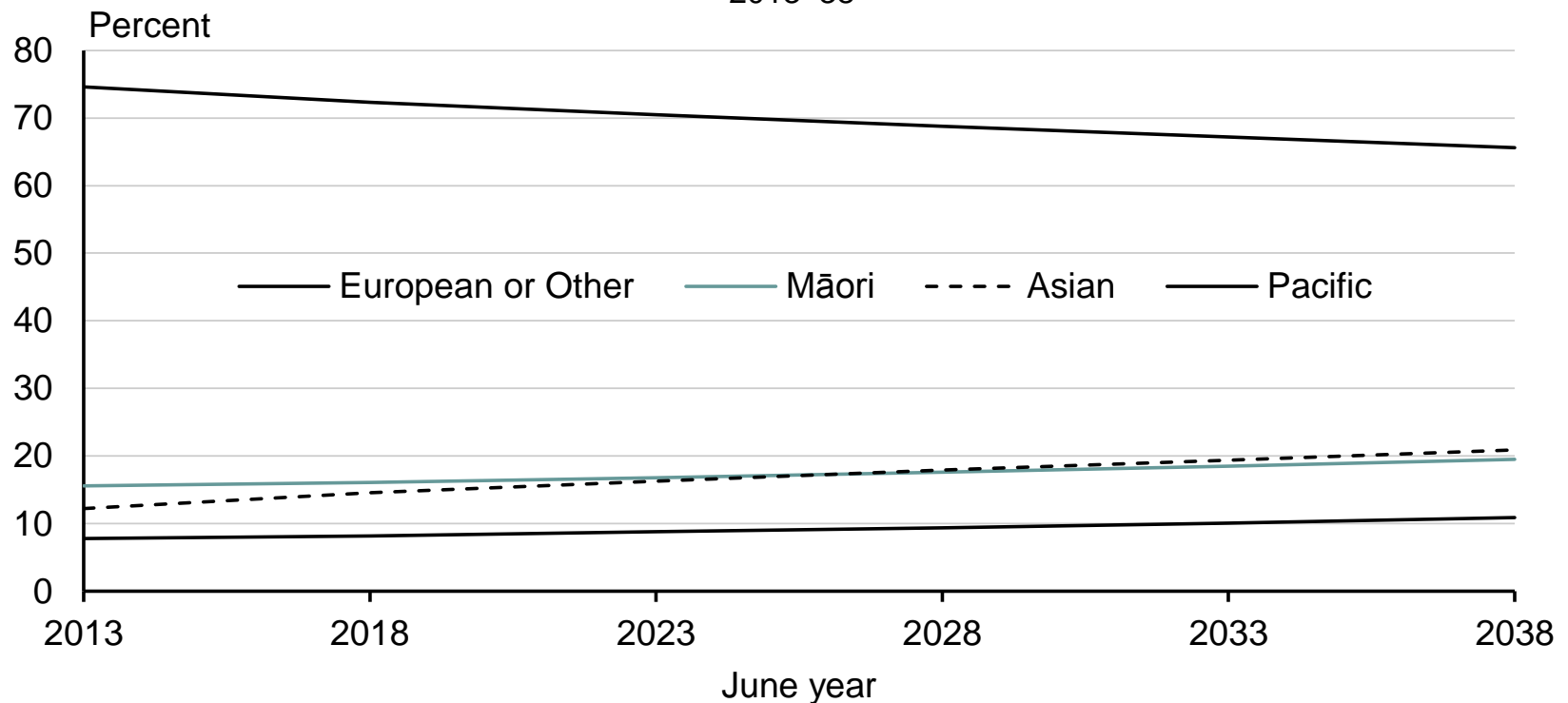

2013–38

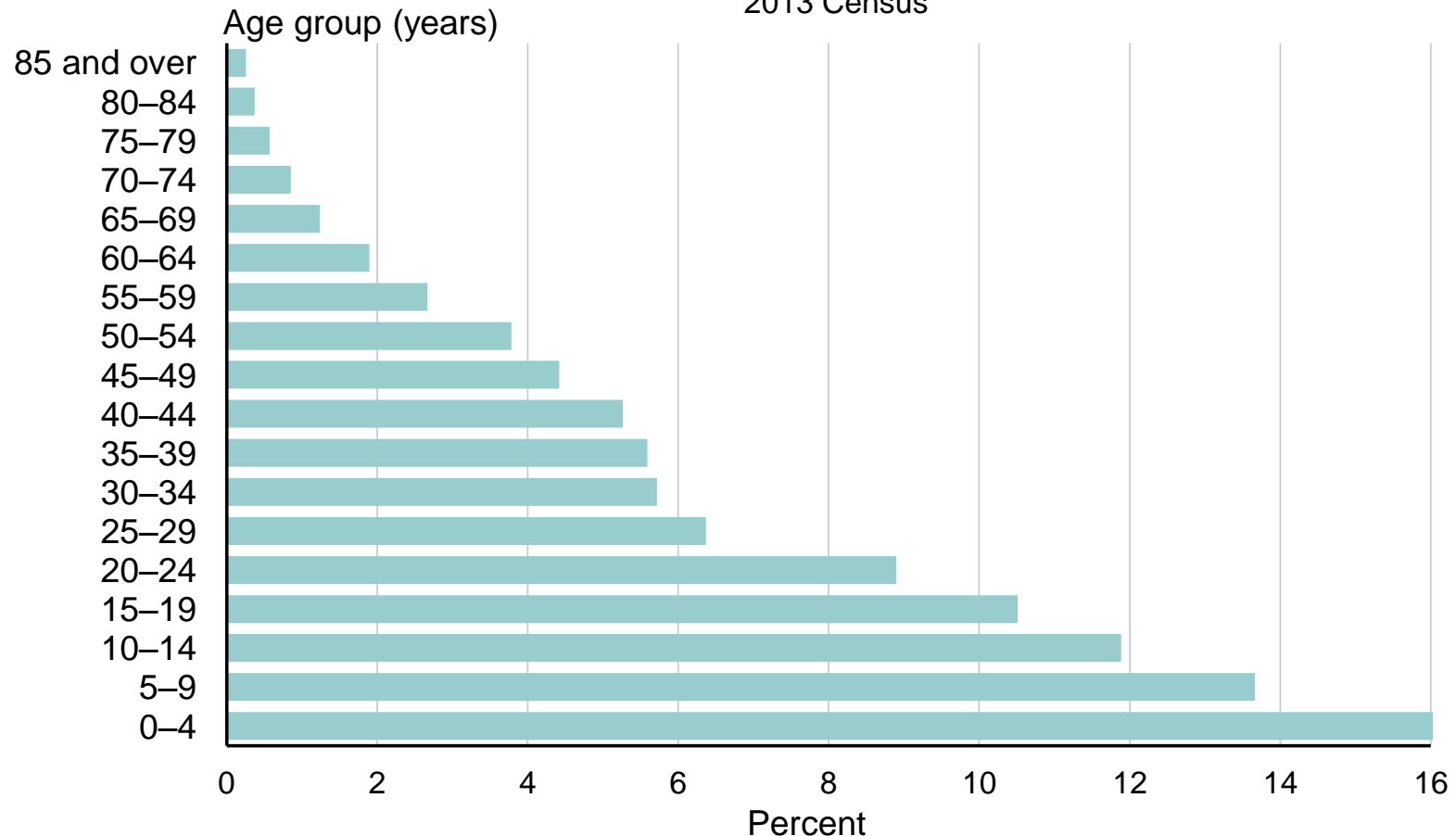

People with more than one ethnic group

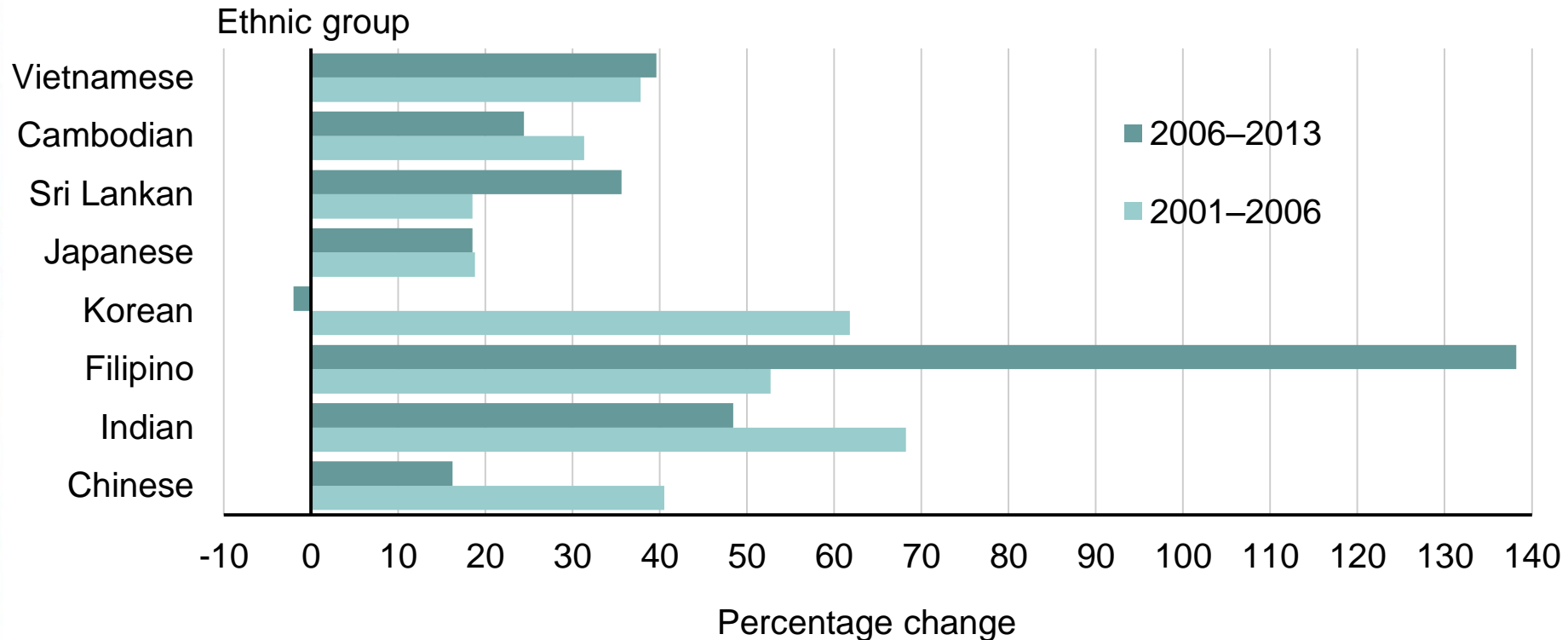
By age group

Indian ethnic group growing faster than Chinese

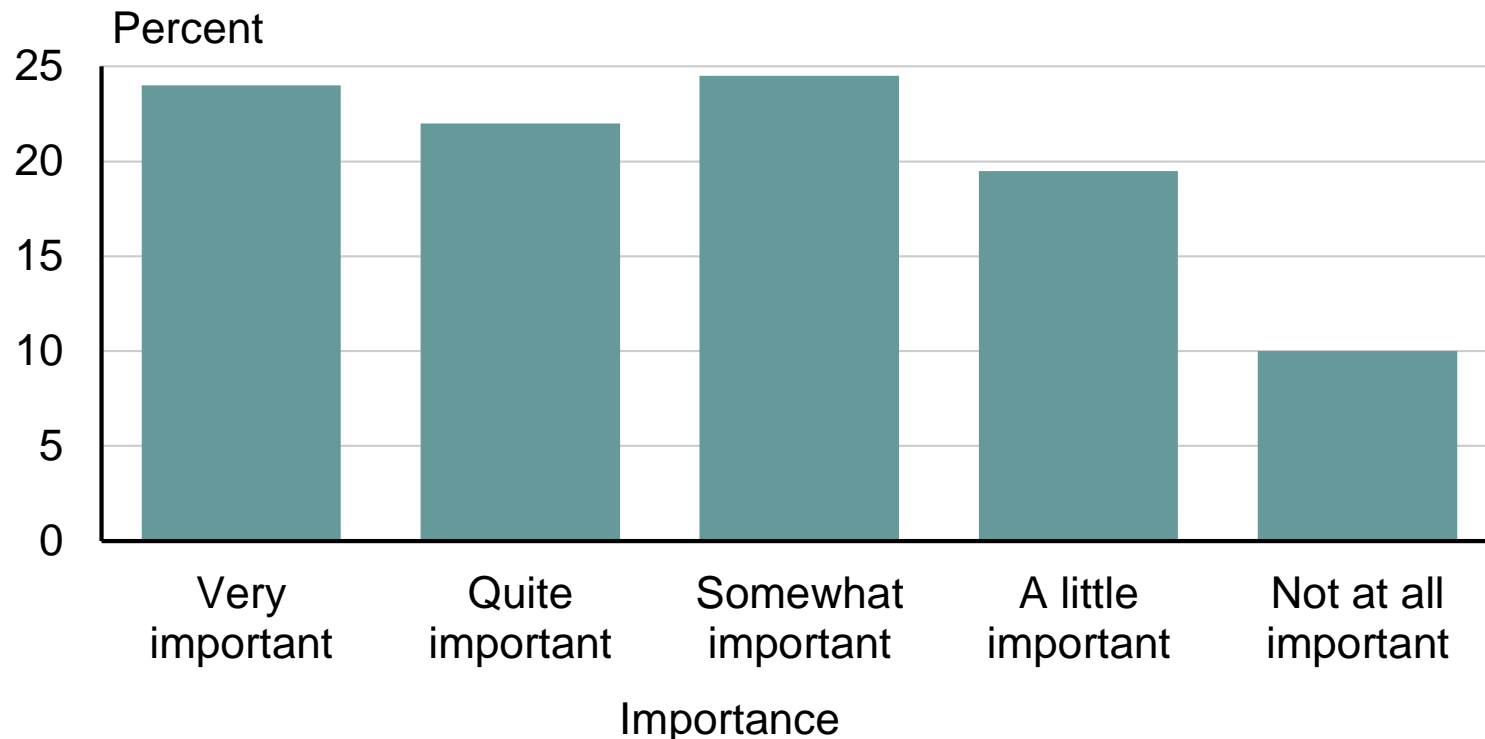
Population growth of Asian ethnic groups

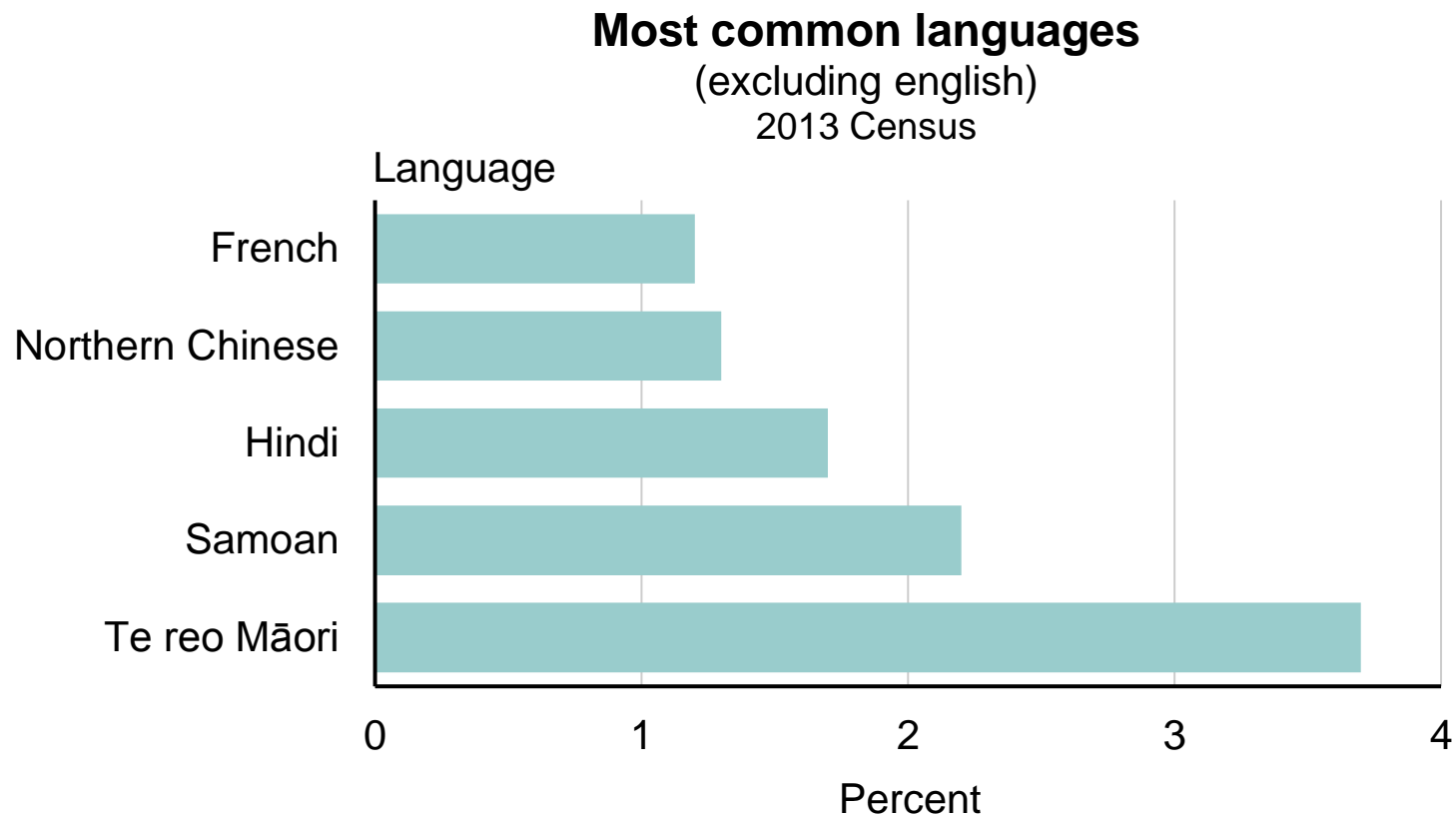
There is also diversity within ethnic groups

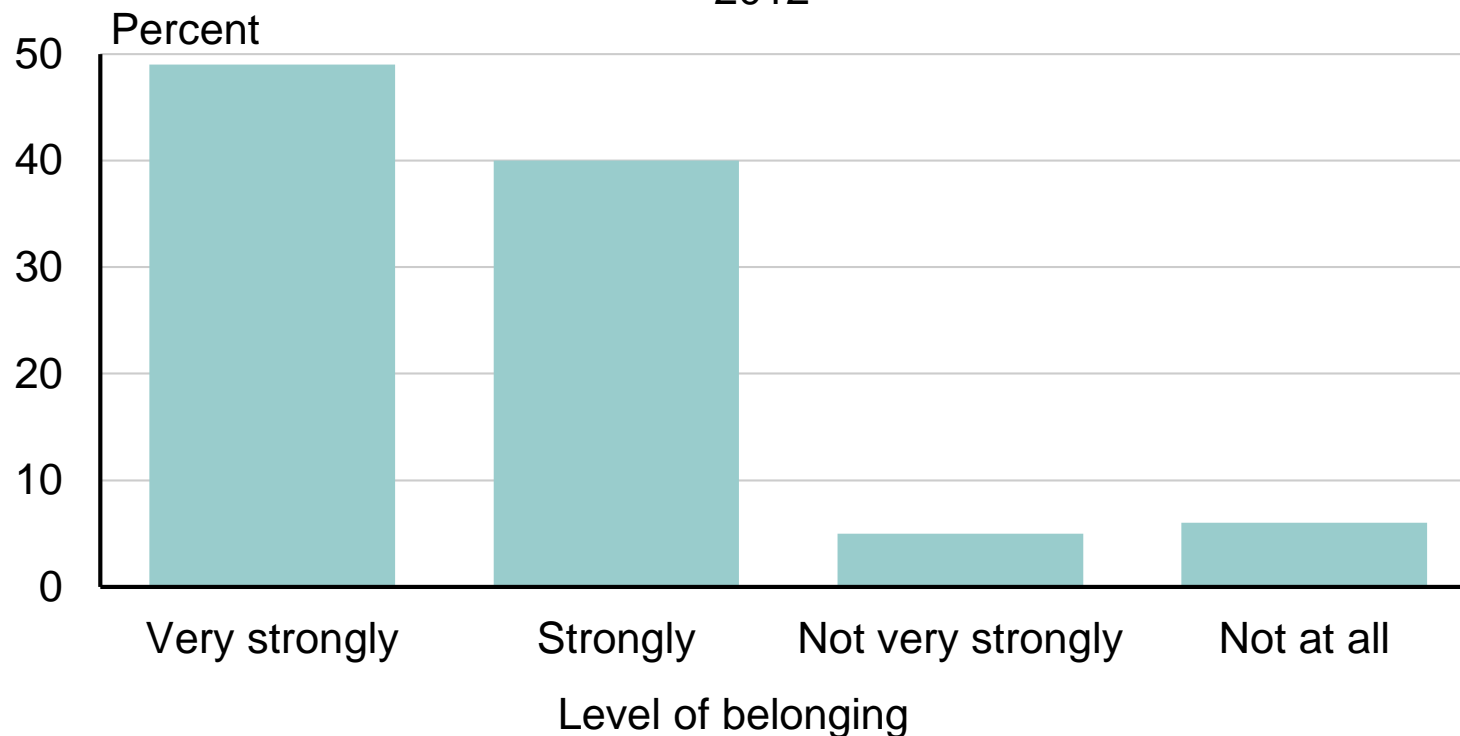
Hindi replaces French as the fourth most common language

2012

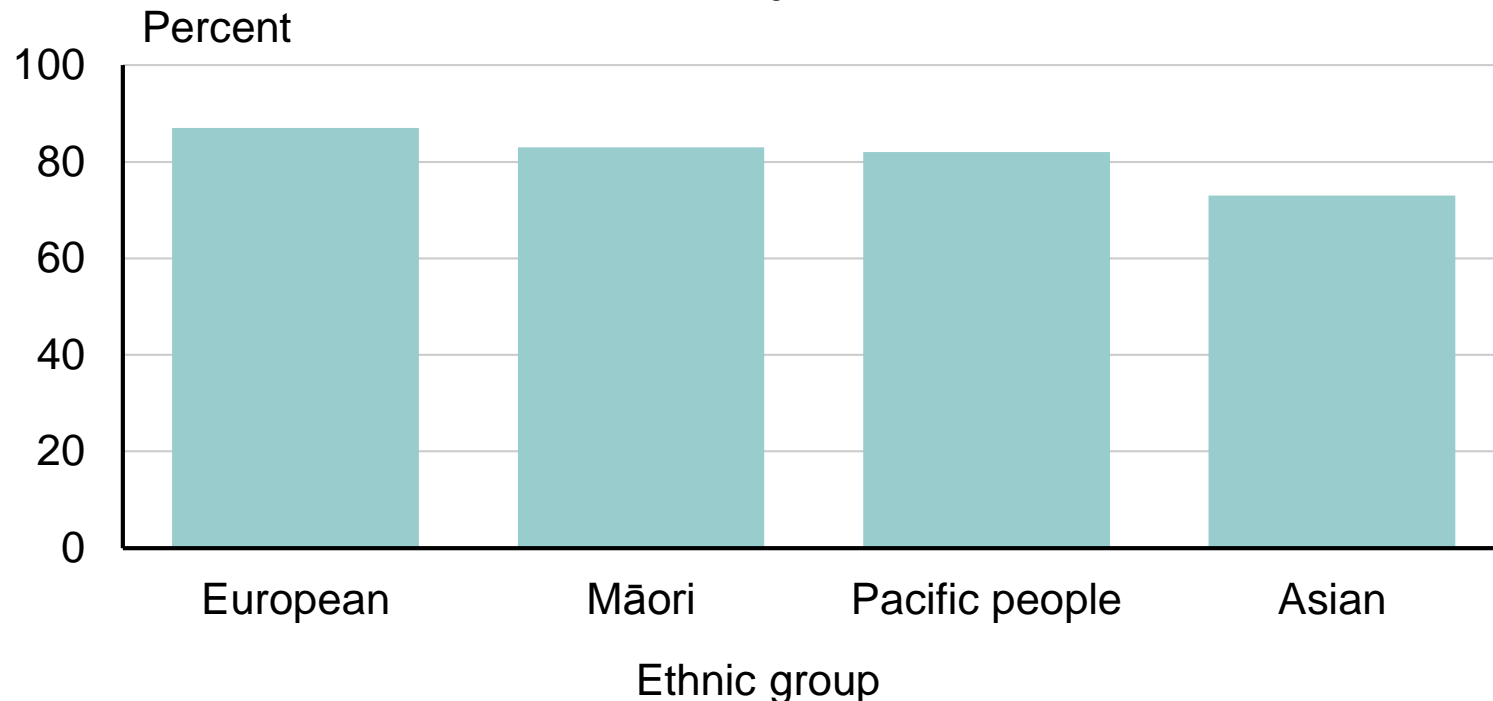

2012



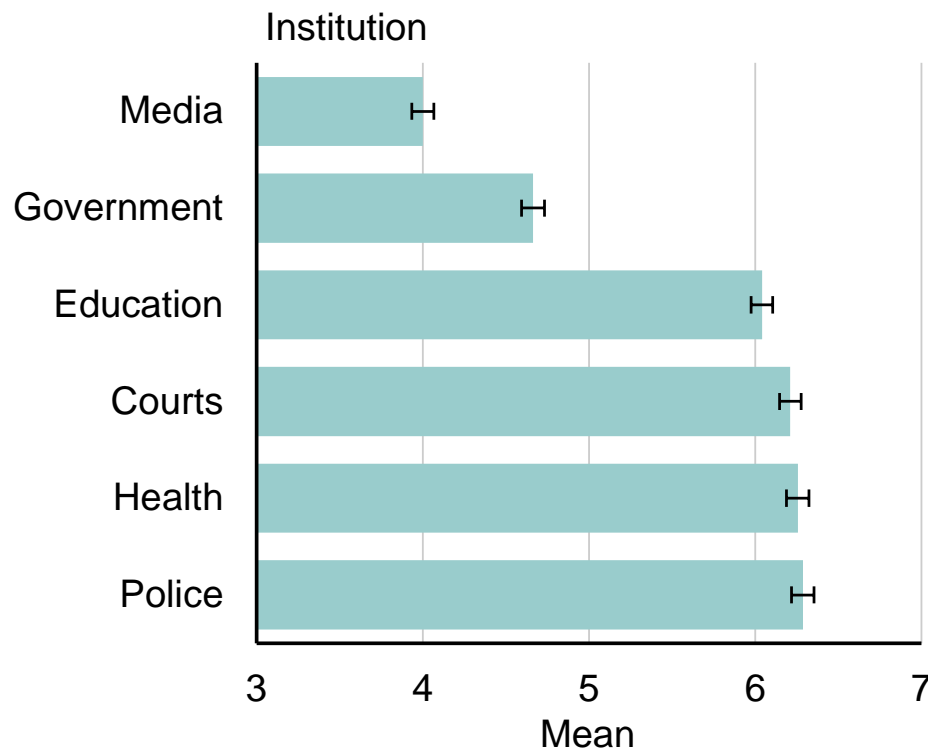

Mean rating of trust in institutions

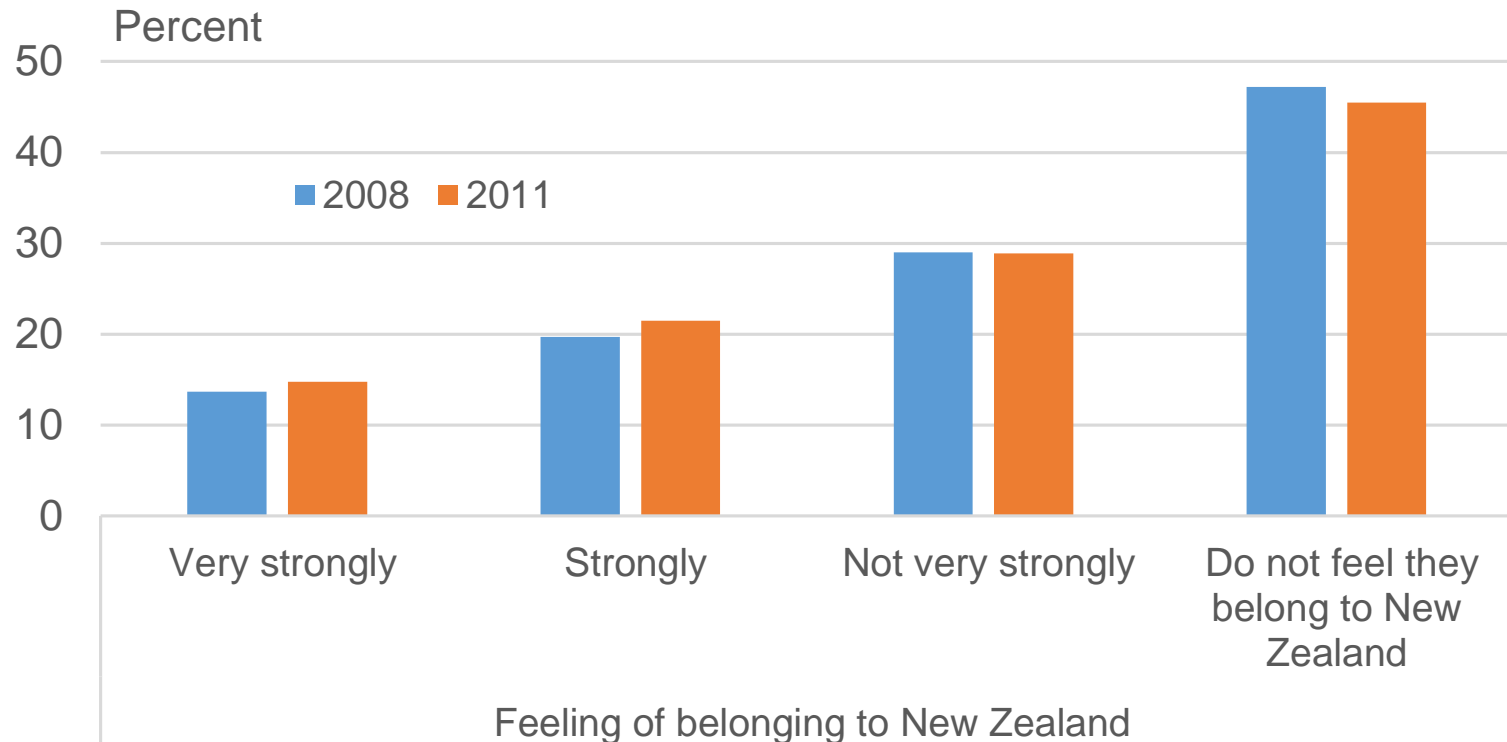
